Revelation 1.4b-8

4 John to the seven churches that are in Asia:

John 18.33-37

33 Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' ³⁴Jesus answered, 'Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?' ³⁵Pilate replied, 'I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?' ³⁶Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from

here.' ³⁷Pilate asked him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.'

No More 1 in 3

Each year Mothers' Union supports the United Nations 16 Days of Activism against Domestic and Gender Violence from 25th November to 10th December. This year MU members in Ely Diocese will be holding a 3 minute silent vigil outside the Cathedral to remember the 1 in 3 women worldwide who experience domestic violence or sexual abuse. Cases of domestic violence have increased during the pandemic. We all need to say no more 1 in 3. Please pray for the following, in church and in your prayers.

- Women needing access to refuges and for more emergency accommodation.
- The outlawing of child brides – each year 12 million girls marry before the age of 18.
- The trafficking of young children.

Pray that we may bring love and respect into the small and hidden places, to those who feel unvalued and unseen.
