34 Then Peter began to speak to them:
'I truly understand that God shows no
partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone
who fears him and does what is right is
acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the
message he sent to the people of
Israel, preaching peace by Jesus
Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷That
message spread throughout Judea,
beginning in Galilee after the baptism
that John announced: ³⁸how God
anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the
Holy Spirit and with power; how he
went about doing good and healing all
who were oppressed by the devil, for
God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses
to all that he did both in Judea and in
Jerusalem. They put him to death by
hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised
him on the third day and allowed him to
appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us
who were chosen by God as witnesses,
and who ate and drank with him after
he rose from the dead. ⁴²He
commanded us to preach to the people
and to testify that he is the one
ordained by God as judge of the living
and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify
about him that everyone who believes
in him receives forgiveness of sins
through his name.'

Mark 16:1-8

16When the sabbath was over, Mary
Magdalene, and Mary the mother of
James, and Salome bought spices, so
that they might go and anoint him. ²And
very early on the first day of the week,
when the sun had risen, they went to
the tomb. ³They had been saying to one
another, 'Who will roll away the stone
for us from the entrance to the
tomb?' ⁴When they looked up, they saw
that the stone, which was very large,
had already been rolled back. ⁵As they
entered the tomb, they saw a young
man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on
the right side; and they were
alarmed. ⁶But he said to them, 'Do not
be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus
of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has
been raised; he is not here. Look, there
is the place they laid him. ⁷But go, tell
his disciples and Peter that he is going
ahead of you to Galilee; there you will
see him, just as he told you.' ⁸So they
went out and fled from the tomb, for
terror and amazement had seized
them; and they said nothing to anyone,
for they were afraid.

Easter Thanksgiving for the vaccine (news from the diocese)

Many of us have felt a great sense of
joy and relief as they have received the
vaccine. Others are confident that their

turn will come soon. As a way of expressing our gratitude we as a diocese have the opportunity to support our brothers and sisters in Rwanda. Like all countries they have experienced school and church closures alongside much of business. Normal life for them has stopped as well. This has meant that some of the poorest and most vulnerable in the country have suffered the most. Last year we supported their food programme. This year let's continue that as well as support others in Kigali diocese- those with no savings and very little income as they are dependent on what they can earn during the day. Paul in Colossians 3 reminds the church to let the peace of Christ rule our hearts, to be thankful and to express our gratitude.
