Revelation 5.1-10

5Then I saw in the right hand of the one seated on the throne a scroll written on the inside and on the back, sealed with seven seals;²and I saw a mighty angel proclaiming with a loud voice, 'Who is worthy to open the scroll and break its seals?'³And no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll or to look into it. ⁴And I began to weep bitterly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it. ⁵Then one of the elders said to me, 'Do not weep. See, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals.'

6 Then I saw between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders a Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. ⁷He went and took the scroll from the right hand of the one who was seated on the throne. ⁸When he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell before the Lamb, each holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.⁹They sing a new song:
'You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slaughtered

and by your blood you ransomed for God saints from every tribe and language and people and nation;
¹⁰ you have made them to be a kingdom and priests serving our God, and they will reign on earth

John 1.43-end

43 The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, 'Follow me.'⁴⁴Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. ⁴⁵Philip found Nathanael and said to him, 'We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth.'⁴⁶Nathanael said to him, 'Can anything good come out of Nazareth?' Philip said to him, 'Come and see.'⁴⁷When Jesus saw Nathanael coming towards him, he said of him, 'Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!' ⁴⁸Nathanael asked him, 'Where did you come to know me?' Jesus answered, 'I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called you.'⁴⁹Nathanael replied, 'Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!' ⁵⁰Jesus answered, 'Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these.'⁵¹And he said to him, 'Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man.'

A message for all parents in Trumpington!

I am delighted to say that with the support of Cambridgeshire County Council we have just started a Cambridgeshire Hub of the charity Connected Lives - based in Trumpington!!

The aim of the charity is to offer effective, evidence-based support at the earliest stage of key relationships, giving people the skills and understanding they need to build healthy life-giving connections.

We have two Circle of Security parenting courses starting online this month:

Evening Session: starting 19th January at 8.00 - 9.15pm

Morning Session: 28th January at 10.00-11.15am

The group runs for 8 weeks and is a great way to seek mutual support, understand our child's needs better and in being cared for ourselves we know that we will better be able to care for our children.

One parent has said, "It has helped us navigate through toddler-hood together and strengthened our relationship considerably."

The cost of the course is voluntary and there are bursaries available. There is a

suggested donation of £100 to cover the costs of running the course, although we are grateful for any contribution that you are able to make, particularly in these more challenging times.
