Romans 12.9-end

9 Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; ¹⁰love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. ¹¹Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹²Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. ¹³Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. 14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. ¹⁷Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. ¹⁸If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. ¹⁹Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay,' says the Lord. ²⁰No, 'if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.' ²¹Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Matthew 16.21-end

21 From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. ²²And Peter took him

aside and began to rebuke him, saying, 'God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you.' ²³But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling-block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

24 Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ²⁵For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. ²⁶For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? Or what will they give in return for their life?

27 'For the Son of Man is to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay everyone for what has been done. ²⁸Truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom.'

Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

The APCM and Meeting to Elect Churchwardens (the Church's AGM) had to be postponed in April due to the Coronavirus and will now take place immediately after the 10.00am service on Sunday 27 September. This is when we hear reports on the activities of the church, elect churchwardens, PCC members and Deanery Synod representatives and appoint sidespersons. Anyone can attend, but only those on the electoral roll can vote in PCC and Deanery Synod elections and on other matters put to the meeting. The meeting will be Zoomed to enable as many people as possible to take part.

Church Fabric Repairs

Work will start soon on carrying out essential repairs to the Church's fabric which were identified in the 2018 Architect's Inspection, it will largely be contained within the South Chapel and North Aisle. While the main work will start in early September, initial investigative work on the Thomas Allen Memorial and associated stone work will be carried out during week commencing 17th August. During the works the church will remain open for private prayer on Wednesdays and Fridays 12.00 – 14.00."
