Romans 8.26-end

26 Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. 28 We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. ³⁰And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

31 What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³²He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or

persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all day long;

we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.'

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Matthew 13.31-33, 44-52

31 He put before them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; ³²it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches.'

33 He told them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened.'

44 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

45 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; ⁴⁶on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.

47 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; ⁴⁸when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and

put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. ⁴⁹So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous ⁵⁰and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

51 'Have you understood all this?' They answered, 'Yes.' ⁵²And he said to them, 'Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.'

Church re-opening for Private Prayer

The church building will be open on **Wednesdays and Fridays** from 12noon till 2pm. It will be staffed by a steward during these times. Please enter through the North Door and leave through the door in the chancel. Space for prayer will, at the moment, be confined to the Chancel. Thank you for your patience! We will be making adjustments to the opening arrangements so please watch this space...

Please note that visitors will not have access to the Bakehouse toilet.

Church Re-Opening for Public Worship

The government has granted permission for public worship to recommence in church buildings. This is accompanied by a raft of regulations in order to minimise the risk of spreading the Covid-19 virus. The following is proposed during **August**:

August 2nd - 9am BCP Communion in church with congregation (not zoomed)

10 am Communion (zoomed as per usual, but from church rather than from home). This zoomed service in church will not, for the time being, invite a congregation into the church building. Apologies!

12 noon Church Outside in the churchyard (enjoy your own pic-nic and hear a bible story)

August 9th – 10am Holy Communion zoomed from church (no congregation)

August 16th – 10am Third Sunday zoomed from home (no congregation)

6.30pm Evensong in Church with congregation (not zoomed)

August 23rd - 10am Holy Communion zoomed from church (no congregation)

August 30th – 9am BCP Communion in church with congregation (not zoomed)

10am – Holy Communion zoomed from church (no congregation)

12 noon – Church Outside

In September we hope to resume a 10am congregation in church. More details on that proposal over the next few weeks.

For the BCP and Evening Prayer services in the church building there will be hand sanitizer on entry and a clear indication of where to sit in the nave. Participants will be given a 1662 prayer book to keep and bring with them to future services. A record of who attends these services will also be necessary to aid the government track and trace scheme, so please don't worry if we stand by the door requesting your name! This pattern of services will be updated and modified as government regulations change.
