From the Vicar . . . Happy Easter to everyone!

A time to enjoy brighter days and the beautiful spring flowers. I always look forward to Easter time and finally climbing out of the shackles of winter. It is a special time for Christians who reflect on the death of Jesus and his resurrection.

I've been trying to think of ways to explain this and was reminded of some school trips. I come from the Midlands and it seemed that many of our school trips were visits to various industrial heritage sites. Some of these sites were former working mines. We would descend in a cage down the pit shaft and be let out into long dark tunnels - some as wide and well-lit as main roads; others narrow, pitch black and claustrophobic. I could not imagine spending my working life confined underground, as many people did. The best thing about these visits was the ascent to the surface; open air, sunshine, freedom and a sense of relief.

Ascent and descent are frequently used terms in biblical literature. Put very crudely, when Jesus died on the Cross, Christians believe that he descended into the darkest depths of death before rising to new life. It is the dynamic of Christian discipleship; dying to self and rising to new life with Christ, descending and ascending. In the span of our lives there are many little deaths to self and mini resurrections. Regeneration is always possible.




