





Royal British Legion

Writing this as the terrible events in Sudan have unfolded reminds us that our armed forces are often called on at very short notice to execute tasks that they never thought they would be asked to perform when they joined up, and in quite hostile and uncertain environments, helping desperate people to escape to our civilised society. The headlines have been made by the work of the Royal Marines in holding the airfield north of Khartoum and the civilian Border Force staff who have deployed with them, but what did not make the headlines was the support group of Royal Engineers keeping the runway in such a state of repair that C130 Hercules could land and take off. *Ubique* (everywhere) is their motto.

You may have noticed press articles that from 2023 all new stocks of poppies will be fully recyclable. We will have them but first using up our stocks from previous years.

I have now received the audited 2022 Poppy Collection figures and ours was £20,494, a tremendous figure of which 48% of donations were contactless. The national total was £47.7 million. This will enable the RBL to continue its valuable work, which it has been doing for over 100 years.

Trumpington Park Primary School named Little Wandle Champion School

This is the first in Cambridgeshire and one of only 11 across the UK. The school introduced the resource in September and, following excellent progress, its phonics screening for Reception and Year 1 is well on track for a 90-95% pass rate this year. Following a visit by Little Wandle assessors, it has been selected as a Champion School for its 'exemplary practice',



including meeting 16 Standards of Excellence, and will support other schools in the successful implementation of the resource.

"It is a huge privilege to be named a Little Wandle Champion School in recognition of our work, and drive and desire to contribute to its development and impact in other schools, which will include us being a Little Wandle trainer," said Charlotte Yarrow, Assistant Headteacher and Reading Leader at Trumpington Park.

Trumpington Repair Café

The Repair Cafés movement brings people who want things mended together with people who love mending things. It is growing fast and we now have a group in Trumpington.

Our first café was held on 15 April in Trumpington Pavilion and was a great success. A huge variety of items were brought along a food mixer, a ceramic bird ornament, a CD player, garden shears, torn trousers and an old clock to mention just a few. There was a lovely atmosphere, a lot of cake was eaten, precious items were saved, people saved money on buying new things and a lot less stuff went in the bin lorries going to landfill.



We had more people wanting to book repairs than we had time for, but we are planning to hold four events a year in venues around the village. The second Café being 18 June at Trumpington Meadows Primary School from 2pm to 5pm.


The Clay Farm Centre - Summer Update

All householders pay a precept to the Parish as part of their council tax. The money collected can be used for community-based projects. Registered electors living in the Parish can all have a say in how this money is spent by attending the meeting.
