

From the Vicar . . .

Summer arrived in late June and retreated in July, just as I had discovered the whereabouts of my sandals. Never mind - as this edition reaches you in August the sun will have returned and with it the pleasures of outdoor swimming, picnics and barbecues. Hopefully. The long summer vacation is a mixed blessing for families but here in Trumpington there is an impressive line-up of events to entertain all ages.

Many parents, myself included, will have to wrestle with the question of screen time - how much, how often and when? The thing is, if screens are denied, alternatives have to be provided. I've hit on the idea of journaling: encouraging a period a reflection and writing each day, not as a dull, academic improvement exercise, but to encourage creative thinking and expression.

Journaling can become a safe space and a place to filter difficult emotions; it is a place to be honest where we can ask the questions that no-one else would know or dare to ask us. Scripture is full of penetrating questions. As was the practice for many Jewish rabbis, Jesus taught using questions such as:

Why are you afraid, you of little faith? What do you want me to do for you? Do you love me more than these?

Questions like these call us to probe our deepest self. Whatever a person chooses to write about, there is something cathartic about letting go with pen on paper. This was apparent in July when MOPS (Mothers of Pre-schoolers) hosted a session on the practice of journaling with 'Good Life Designed' (sample right). It is hoped that they will return next term for another session.







Royal British Legion





Trumpington Residents' Association (TRA)

The TRA needs your help if we are to continue with the wide range of activities that we have undertaken in recent years. Here is an update about what we do.

We hold regular members' meetings with guest speakers and discussions of developments and issues of concern (there is information about the next meetings on the News page on the website, details below). Since 2009, we have also run Trumpington Pavilion on behalf of the City Council. This has been very successful but, if we are to continue, we need additional help from one or two people who are able to support the staff in managing the service. In the last three years, we have also run

Trumpington Food Hub from the Pavilion, helping around 150 people each week, with lots of support from funders and volunteers.

We have a long track record of organising community events, including Jubilee and Christmas celebrations, but we need new volunteers to be able to do so in the future.

The Trumpington of today has benefitted immensely from the TRA's engagement with the design of the major housing developments and the Local Plans, giving support, but raising concerns where appropriate. Transport plans to meet the growth in jobs and population and the rapid development of our close neighbour, the Cambridge Biomedical Campus, also demand continued attention.

Trumpington Local History Group

After two successful and well-attended village history walks in June, we are now looking ahead to our programme of indoor meetings.

The first of these will be on Thursday 28 September, when we will be presenting various topics on the theme of 'Post-war Trumpington 1945-1980', 7pm at the Clay Farm Centre, admission £2.50. The following two meetings will be on 16 November and 29 February - details to follow next time.

Our website (trumpingtonlocalhistorygroup.org) now has reports of recent activity, including Dr Sam Lucy's excellent February talk on 'Excavations at Trumpington Meadows: Putting the Trumpington Cross in Context' and local Coronation events in May. If you want to know anything about Trumpington's past, you will probably find it on the website somewhere - just use the search box at the bottom of each page.

Trumpington Meadows exhibition at the Museum of Archaeology & Anthropology From 21 June 2023 to 14 April 2024, new evidence about the bed burial and cross discovered during the Trumpington Meadows excavation are a highlight of an exhibition in the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology in Downing Street, Cambridge: 'Beneath our Feet: Archaeology of the Cambridge Region'.

The exhibition has a reconstruction of the bed burial, with some of the most important finds placed in position, including the cross, pins and other grave goods. It also includes a forensic artist's likeness of the teenage girl. Following isotopic analysis of her bones and teeth, it is though that she moved to Britain as a young girl, around 7 years old, probably from the area that is now Germany, and she was around 16 years old when she died. The evidence from the excavation shows that the community at that time (7th century AD) had inhabitants who raised sheep, kept chickens and grew crops, spun wool, played board games and gathered in a large hall. For information about the excavation and subsequent research, also the



Trumpington Community Orchard

The wildflower meadow is in full bloom and the apple trees are covered with fruit. Thanks to a willing bunch of Astra Zeneca volunteers from Chesterford Park, the meadow around the trees has been tidied and paths to them properly defined. The herb garden has also been weeded and replanted. The trunks from the thinned out cherry thicket have been colonised by a variety of wildlife and provided a feast for the birds nesting in the boxes and trees.

The refurbished Swift Tower boxes were all greatly appreciated by the local sparrows and the returning swifts, both happily sharing the accommodation. It is really amazing to see pairs of swifts and sparrows taking turns in entering the same box with no squabbles evident despite the small spaces available for parents and their offspring. This year there have been at least seven pairs of swifts nesting in the boxes and the newer pairs have occupied those in the front of the tower while the returning pairs appear to occupy the side boxes. The summer brood of sparrows has already fledged and the baby swifts should be ready to leave their nests in the next few weeks. There has also been interest in the tower from a number of new pairs so it is likely that all the boxes will be occupied when they return next year.

Our next volunteering session is on Sunday 17 September (11am-2pm) - please join us, we need all the help we can get. Note this is grandparents day, and grandparents are welcome to come with their grandchildren!

Finally, we would like to re-instate the moth day and bat walks as these are a great opportunity for local children (and adults!) to learn about wildlife - so if you know any moth or bat identification experts please pass on our contact details.


