The TRA is very grateful to all our volunteers and supporters who have helped in the last four years and to CCFb for its new initiative. Trumpington Meadows work with Police to solve burglaries

A number of properties in Trumpington Meadows were hit by a spate of what police called 'opportunistic' burglaries at the beginning of February. It transpires that some residents had not fully secured their properties or garages/outhouses, which led to an opportunity to commit crimes.

As a result, the local Keep TMSafe WhatsApp group (linked with TMDAG) swung into action and a call was put out to residents asking for more information and possible footage to assist the police.

The Keep TMSafe group was set up five years ago as a direct result of the initial traveller incursion onto the meadows and has now grown to almost 200 members. With their own community police liaison member, the residents are in a strong position to help all aspects of security on the development. Over 10 videos from a range of properties on the development were checked by residents and passed onto the police. As a direct result the police were able to make arrests within two weeks.

Updating the local community, Police constable Kerslake said 'Last night officers arrested a suspect and found stolen property on him linked to seven of the burglaries. We will be dealing with him in custody throughout today. I cannot comment any further but I wanted to update you and the community. The suspect was charged and remanded for 8 dwelling burglaries, 2 attempted burglaries along with a shoplifting and theft of a pedal cycle. The suspect will now face trial for all of the above offences but as of writing I do not yet know when this will be. Obviously there is another suspect outstanding that we



have not been able to identify... Regardless of this, charges for ten burglaries is a fantastic result and I would like to extend my thanks to everyone that supplied CCTV footage during the course of the investigation as it has been crucial in piecing together the movements of the suspect.'

The solving of the Trumpington Meadows burglaries contrasts sharply with a recent report in the Telegraph with the headline 'Police solve no burglaries in half of the country'. A Trumpington Meadows spokesman said 'This just goes to show how a community working together can make a big difference and we would encourage other areas in Trumpington to follow our lead'; another commented 'We must be the community with the most doorbell cameras per square metre in Cambridge'.

Trumpington Meadows Delivery & Action Group (TMDAG)

Residents in Trumpington Meadows were treated to a feast of entertainment recognising the Chinese Year of the Dragon as the development celebrated in style on Saturday 17 February. Hundreds of local residents were entertained for two hours by over 90 Chinese performers of all ages on a stage in the local centre, located outside the primary school and by the newly opened La Reina Cafe.





The event was sponsored by the South Trumpington Parish Meeting and TMDAG with local Chinese residents volunteering and performances presented by the Cambridge Chinese Community in association with Dreams and Wishes Events. The crowd was especially enthralled by a performance from the children's dance class with stars aged from just three years old. A further 15 performances included the Happy Exercise Dance group, DAI Peacock Dance, Tibetan Dance, The Little Princesses of Qing Dynasty, Yang Guan Sa Di Ensemble and many, many more.

Inside the school, residents could sample traditional Chinese costumes and crafts and take part in calligraphy (the art of handwriting) workshops, as well as enjoy the feast of Chinese food on sale. Outside, a range of local food vans that regularly attend the local centre were offering more traditional fare.

The Dreams and Wishes dragon stilt walker roamed around the visitors along with the annual Lion Dance getting a wide range of surprised reactions from young and old alike.

Until recently, the Cambridge Chinese Community rehearsed in the school community premises on a Sunday so were able to use this special event as a way of re-connecting with the local community.

Royal British Legion

Almost half way between the very successful 2023 Poppy Appeal and the upcoming 2024 Poppy Appeal reminds me that just a year ago I visited a war grave of an RAF pilot in the Netherlands. It is a sobering thought that 4,000 RAF planes crashed in the Netherlands alone in World War II. Recalling the visit reminded me that we currently live in very troubled times with more British service personnel again on active duty around the world than hitherto. Irrespective of the rank (from Private to Field Marshall) the headstone and wording are identical except for differences of creed which are shown by the symbol on the top of the stone. You will be very moved.

As we approach summer, I will be starting to prepare the volunteer rota for the 2024 Poppy Appeal (Saturday 26 October to Sunday 10 November). Anyone who wishes to help is most welcome, just let me know. Even if you can only cover a single 1½ hr shift the offer will be gratefully received: you get to talk with and meet some very nice people. I hope we can again collect a record sum for the Appeal to assist those who still need support after they leave the armed forces.





Trumpington Community Orchard

The annual Wassail on 14 January was well attended as always with the usual festivities despite the unfortunate absence of the Lord of Misrule with pneumonia (we are glad to say he has now recovered). Local stalwart Ursula led the usual assortment of folk musicians and the now traditional Wassail dance. The Wassail started in the Community Orchard and processed to the Clay Farm Community Gardens with mulled apple juice served outside their Pavilion. It is now likely to be the continued format for future years.

We look forward to the delivery in April of the two picnic tables generously funded by Trumpington Garden Society in time for a Corporate Volunteer Day. Another picnic table, kindly donated by a local patron, will provide added seating near the swift tower



and was very competently assembled by the weekly volunteers from the Leys (thank you girls). We had a visit by four classes from Trumpington Park Primary School on the same day and our budding young naturalists focussed on spotting signs of spring including the many clumps of both wild and cultivated daffodils (see pic) and the few remaining snowdrops, vincas, alkanet and the flowering currant just breaking bud.

We await the return of the swifts this spring to their shared accommodation with the squatting sparrows who had to evacuate their squat for a couple of weeks as it was again destructively attacked by the local delinquent squirrel. The metal-reinforced nesting box entrances did survive the assault, but the persistent pest managed to gnaw through the roof and into one of the nesting boxes (see pic) resulting in the tower being abandoned by the local sparrows. We have now put up some reinforced defences in an upturned compost bin lid which, together with the scat matting, does appear to have deterred the invader, and the local sparrows have returned to occupy all the nesting boxes. This reinforced swift tower (see pic) will hopefully remain impregnable for the return of the swifts, but any advice on other potential long-term solutions are welcome.

We will again be participating in Blossom Day on Bank Holiday Monday, 6 May with a variety of nature activities 2-4pm. A folk group kindly assembled by the recovered Lord of Misrule, Nigel Pennick, will provide some musical entertainment so do come and join in with your instruments.

The next Orchard Maintenance session will be from 11-1pm on Sunday 9 June. Please come dressed in weatherproof clothing and footwear and we will provide gloves and necessary tools.


