Ride + Stride across Cambridgeshire on Saturday 14 September

Ride + Stride is the original mass fundraising event linked to the Cambridgeshire Historic Churches Trust and has a history dating back some 40 years.



Ride + Stride traditionally involves people being sponsored to walk or cycle to as many churches as possible in one day. But there are other ways you can take part, from travelling on horse or by canoe, to holding an event or spending an afternoon exploring the wildlife in a churchyard and donating money.

Money raised from the Ride + Stride event funds a substantial part of the annual grants budget of the Cambridgeshire Historic Trust helping churches of all denominations across the county with essential repairs and improvements.

Here in Trumpington the church will be open as usual, with the added attraction of light refreshments available from 10am to 4pm.

SEASON OF CREATION 2024

Creationtide or the Season of Creation is the period in the annual church calendar, from 1 September to 4 October, dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of all life.

As the Season of Creation ends we shall celebrate with **Harvest Thanksgiving on Sunday 6 October**. The 10am All Age Holy Communion will be followed by a bring and share lunch in church.

8.30am BCP Holy Communion is from the Book of Common Prayer – a quiet, traditional communion service.

10am Holy Communion is a service using liturgy from Common Worship with hymns and music, and with Junior Church on 2nd and 4th Sundays (not in August).

10am All Age Communion is a more contemporary communion service specifically for 'all ages'. There is no Junior Church on this Sunday as the children stay for the service.

10am Third Sunday Experience and Explore is an informal service without communion; it includes a talk, a time for personal reflection, activities for all ages and refreshments.

6.30pm BCP Evening Prayer takes place on third Sundays.

As I write this, it is just a few weeks after the 80th anniversary commemorations of the start of Operation Overlord, or D Day as it is usually known. Trumpington Community Orchard

Most of the heritage variety apple trees and the crab apple trees in the hedgerow are all laden with fruit. This was a surprise as we had such a large infestation of ermine moth webs with caterpillars that we decided to abandon our futile attempts to clear the webs and leave nature to fend for itself. However, apart from the Thodays Quarrandon, all the other heritage varieties seem to have survived without too much damage. Unfortunately, a cold spell of weather seems to have killed off all the fruit on the quince tree, which was also the case with most cultivated cherry trees on the local allotment, though the wild cherry trees in the thicket were surprisingly not affected.

We hope that the wildflower meadow will remain in bloom until the expected abundance of peacock butterflies if all the caterpillars around the orchard successfully pupate.

Before we managed to clean out the observational beehive, it was re-colonised by a new swarm and now has a thriving population of wild bees who have added another couple of honeycombs to fill the beehive.

On the wildlife front, we are happy to report the return of our swift visitors, with the tower now boasting nine nesting pairs with some of the nests again occupied by both swifts and sparrows sharing their residence as in previous years. There really is a lot humans can learn from our local birds! We are still looking into the possibility of installing a nestbox camera in the tower so any technical help or advice would be welcome. We also hope to have a Moth night in the autumn if one of the local experts has an available slot, so do keep an eye on the notice board outside the Orchard.

The involvement of corporate volunteers has been fantastic for the upkeep of the orchard, with two local teams from Hays and AZ not just enabling us to keep on top of the maintenance but also clearing the picnic space and improving both the herb garden and new soft fruit raised beds.

We do, however, still need the active participation of local volunteers and the next Orchard maintenance session will be from 11am-1pm on Sunday 8 September. As always you need to come dressed in weatherproof clothing and footwear and we will provide gloves and necessary tools. We would again particularly welcome volunteers willing to play a more active role in the organisation and maintenance of the Orchard to ensure the long-term future of this now well-utilised local biodiversity haven.

Are you concerned about the planned East West Rail route between Cambridge and Oxford which would run through neighbouring parishes?

East West Rail is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project as set out in the Planning Act 2008, so the proposers must apply for a Development Consent Order to obtain approval to build the line between Bedford and Cambridge and carry out statutory consultation on the project. This provides an opportunity to influence the design.

Construction would certainly have a major impact on the area and the railway would have significant implications for the growth agenda in and around south Cambridge.

If the TRA is to respond adequately to this consultation, we need to form a working party to look at the merits and the details of the proposal. If you are able to join such a working party, please contact chair@trumpingtonresidentsassociation.org, and get involved.

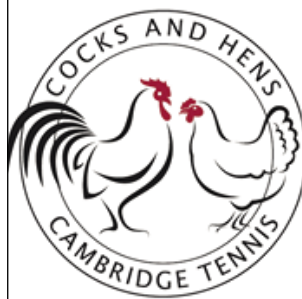
