

Supporting people to connect with wildlife is one of the main aims of the Wildlife Trust movement. In December and January, we joins other Trusts across the UK to encourage people to take part in the 12 Days Wild challenge: do something wild every day from 25 December to 5 January, to help keep nature in mind through midwinter. You can sign up on our website and tag us in social media @wildlifebcn, #12DaysWild. Here are a few ideas:

- Visit the Wildlife Trust BCN website and find a new nature reserve to explore nearby (Trumpington Meadows and Cambourne Nature Reserves have miles of paths, including some that are surfaced)
- Go stargazing
- Spot tracks and signs of wildlife like feathers, burrows, and footprints
- Submit a wildlife record (visit the website of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Environmental Records Centre to find out how)
- Refresh yourself about what you can put in the recycling bin
- Take a longer walk to visit the latest Trumpington Meadows Nature Reserve residents (a small herd of belted Galloway cattle from The Wandering Herd are undertaking important conservation grazing in the meadows to the south of the M11) You can also join our monthly meander on Monday 9 December 9.30-12. 

#### Fairtrade Fortnight - Thank you


