Your Church: the Future – Churchwarden Edmund writes . . .

Many readers will be aware that the church has been looking at its needs for the future. After much consultation and deliberation, the Chancellor of the Diocese is set to approve proposals for the re-ordering of our Grade 1 listed building. We would like to share these plans with the wider community.

While respecting the impressive architecture and characteristics of the 13th/14th century structure, largely built with soft Barnack Stone, the objective is to provide essential extra facilities and a decent space for greater use by Trumpington organisations and allow more flexible church services. The work could take up to 10 years to complete and needs to be phased.

The first priority is to completely rewire the building taking into consideration the alterations that will follow. We hope to get this vital work completed in 2025.

The next phase of work is yet to be confirmed but based on the needs highlighted during our consultations, we are likely to be converting the existing Vestry into a fully accessible toilet and providing a kitchenette along the north wall of the North Chapel. This phase will require the removal of pews in the North Aisle and the relocation of the Font to the west of the North Door. The North Door



will eventually become the main weekday entrance to the church, making it accessible for users of wheelchairs and mobility scooters.

Removing the South Aisle pews will allow space for a new Vestry at the west end and also improve access to the South Chapel, which will be retained as a space for work with children. The provision of storage solutions will follow. These works will allow enhanced space for activities and meetings. Extra seating for large services and events will be provided by lightweight stackable chairs.

Existing funds will permit the rewiring to be completed and further phases will depend on raising sufficient funds. Once the full permission is given in the form of a Faculty (the Church of England's equivalent to planning permission) a major fundraising effort will be launched with the aim of ensuring sufficient money is available for a continuous programme of works. The church will welcome any expressions of interest in helping with the fundraising, seeking grants or assisting with a donation. This is a complicated project, but one which will give Trumpington a facility to be used by all. Please do contact me if you wish to be involved or would like more information.

Christmas Tree Festival 2024





Royal British Legion

I am delighted to report that the 2024 Poppy Appeal has to date raised just over £22,000, a significant increase on 2023, a tribute not only to those who so generously donated but also to those who assisted with collecting in any way, whether in Waitrose or elsewhere. Thank you all!

The start of 2025 marked the 80th anniversary of the end of the Battle of the Bulge in the dense forests of the Ardennes, the last major German offensive of World War II. This year also marks the 80th anniversary of both VE Day (8 May), and more importantly for Cambridgeshire, VJ Day (15 August). There are a few veterans alive who served in World War II and this demonstrates the need to support former members of the armed forces for many decades after they served, defending our shores and freedom.

The determination of disabled veterans to succeed against apparently insuperable injuries both mental and physical is an example to us all. After attending the Defence Medical Rehabilitation Centre (now at Stanford Hall near Loughborough after the late Duke of Westminster spearheaded a campaign for a purpose-built centre to replace Headley Court) many achieve goals we might think impossible. While the MoD funds the facility, their recovery also benefits from financial input from the Royal British Legion, facilitated by readers' donations to the Poppy Appeal.

As we progress through 2025, let us be sure to remember those who made the supreme sacrifice and did not live to see VE Day and VJ Day. Let us also continue to support veterans of World War II and more recent conflicts, remembering our armed forces still serve to protect us and the lives we lead today.



Following the excited autumn visit by four classes of enthusiastic youngsters from Trumpington Park Primary School, the start of the winter has been rather tranquil at the Orchard. This second school visit was very educational for the children, as they were able to learn how the Orchard changes during the various seasons. We are full of admiration for the teachers and parents who provide such a rich experience for young minds. Their visits also emphasise the importance of teaching our young people love and respect for nature, to help avoid some unfortunate recent incidents at the Orchard by a few teens, who clearly don't understand the purpose of raised beds and saplings. We are, however, keen to work with our local secondary schools to further the responsible education of our youge people.

The Orchard continues to be popular with corporate volunteers. Visits by local volunteers from Hays and AZ has meant that the hedgerow has been well maintained and the rampant brambles now provide suitable habitat for small mammals and birds through the winter. This has been particularly welcome as the planned quarterly maintenance session in December had to be cancelled due to inclement weather.

We start 2025 with the celebration of our yearly Wassail and will report on the festivities in the next issue of *The Trumpet*. We hope this year to reinstate some of our previous biodiversity activities and would again ask for any knowledgeable volunteers, amateur or

professional, who would be happy to run a moth night and/or bat walk. We would also welcome any suggestions for other activities to enrich the experience of the local community and particularly young people.

Our next Orchard next maintenance session is planned for Sunday 9 February. As always you need to come dressed in weatherproof clothing and footwear and we will provide gloves and necessary tools. Hope to see you soon!

Happy New Year! Our happy band of volunteers has been very busy. Every week, we collect huge amounts of donations from Clay Farm Library and the Bakehouse. We take them away and sort them into age groups (having first checked that they are in good order and fit to be re-homed) and then we run around, topping up the rails at Fawcett Primary School and the Hub Corner at Trumpington Meadows Primary School.



Next, we think about our pick-your-own stalls and also about filling boxes for families that are not able to attend our stalls. Since we started our venture, we have made up bespoke boxes for some 860 children and welcomed more than 680 families to our pop-up events. That's a lot of clothes that are being put to good use, instead of going to landfill!

A highlight of our year was the Church Christmas Tree Festival. Our theme was 'Pocket Treasures'. We often find little surprises that have been collected by children and stowed away in pockets, so we thought they should be saved and displayed on our tree. I wonder if any visiting children recognised one of their own treasures?

We have already planned some dates for pick-your-own stalls: We will be holding a pop-up stall at Trumpington Meadows School on 1 March and at Trumpington Village Hall on 5 April. Our grateful thanks to the school and the village hall for allowing us to use their facilities, free of charge and to our generous sponsors, who make it possible for us to hire a van to transport the clothes to the venues. Please come along, if you can, we will have lots of lovely clothes, all neatly folded and waiting patiently for a new home.



Trumpington Federation




