From the Vicar . . .

I've recently visited some friends who I hadn't seen for twenty years. It is strange how we all picked up where we left off and sauntered into easy conversation. The passage of time didn't seem to make a lot of difference. It was heartening that we were all pleased to see each other and share joys and woes. It reminded me that friendship is such a valuable gift. I had missed these people and enjoyed discovering what they had been doing.

Jesus had friends who followed him around pretty much everywhere for three years. These friends are generally known as disciples – a community of learners. Reading between the lines, it wasn't always idyllic; there were power bids and disagreements. Judas betrayed Jesus, Peter denied him, and all the other disciples deserted Jesus after his arrest. Love competed with fear and disappointment, and won. Isn't this so often the case?

That's not the end of the story.

At a post-Resurrection beach barbecue, Jesus forgives Peter and reinstates him and his ministry. By implication, the others are also restored and forgiven. Nobody is perfect. We all have flaws. We all hurt others and are hurt by others. But,



the beautiful gift of forgiveness is what Jesus offers to us so that we might offer it to others. Deep friendship can sustain many dents and is characterised by its resilience.

Royal British Legion

This article will be read shortly before the nation observes VE (Victory in Europe) Day and it is likely to be the last major anniversary where veterans of World War II remain with us, apart from VJ Day in August. 80 years is a long time and for those of us born in the years immediately after 1945 it brings back memories of seeing bemedalled veterans such as Stan Newell, an Eighth Army veteran and lifelong member of our local branch of the Royal British Legion, and Ron Kitson, a Far East POW survivor, proudly marching from the War Memorial to our parish church to give thanks for the sacrifice of their comrades, and praying for a peaceful future. We remember them now no less, but hope for an increasingly peaceful world. The recent Invictus Games held in Canada demonstrate what more recently injured veterans can achieve. The advances in combat zone medical support, better rehabilitation facilities, as well as developments in prosthetic limbs, provide opportunities for veterans not available after 1945. Veterans are grateful for this and your donations to the Poppy Appeal help fund the veterans' rehabilitation to allow them to lead a fruitful life.

While the annual Poppy Appeal only lasts for 15 days, fundraising continues throughout the year. An example is the recent camel journey by special service veterans following in the footsteps of Lawrence of Arabia, which raised a significant sum. I know one of those veterans and while he was saddle sore after a month riding, the sum raised made the planning and effort worth it.





Trumpington Community Orchard

We started 2025 with the annual Wassail led by a resurgent Lord of Misrule Nigel, again beginning the festivities in the Orchard and then processing to the Clay Farm Community Gardens to Wassail their apple trees. After the traditional dance led by Ursula, the many revellers all enjoyed some hot mulled apple juice which was well appreciated in the cold winter evening.

The Orchard is now looking neat and ready for the spring with a well-trimmed hedge and the apple and quince trees all pruned at the February maintenance session. We have also added a newly grafted Wayside to replace the original one that had previously died and been replaced with a Gransden Galaxy. The new grafted tree was grafted by our stalwart Canadian volunteer Ethan as a tribute to his new fiancé before they embark on their world travels having recently successfully defended his PhD thesis. We wish them both safe travels and hope they return to work in Cambridge in the future as we need to think of succession planning for the Orchard!

The first signs of spring are already appearing in the Orchard with an increased number of snowdrops and the return of bees to the observational beehive after the winter. The replacement of the beehive will be the next task to be undertaken so any suggestions of appropriate structures that maintain its valuable educational purpose welcome. The sparrows have now repopulated all the



nesting boxes in the swift tower and we await the return of the swifts and the continued friendship between the two species. We have recently been having some visits from a number of red kites that circle over the orchard but this doesn't seem to bother the sparrows or the local robins. The orchard is also visited on an almost daily basis by two muntjac that seem to be resident in either the neighbouring hazel platt or the woods across the busway. Tracks through the hedgerow suggest that the local badgers also enjoy the orchard under the cover of darkness as evidenced by the digging around the trees.

We look forward to 2025 and would still like to reinstate some of our previous biodiversity activities and so appeal again for any knowledgeable volunteers, amateur or professional, who would be happy to run a moth night and/or bat walk.

Our next Orchard next maintenance session is planned for Sunday 8 June 2025. As always you need to come dressed in weatherproof clothing and footwear and we will provide gloves and necessary tools. Hope to see you soon!


