# The MumCo (formerly MOPS)

One of our regular mums was trying to describe what the MumCommunity is:



"Trumpington Mum Community (MumCo) is a group for MUMS with children of any age from birth. The women who run The MumCo are warm, friendly, caring and supportive mothers themselves."

Each MumCo session has a different activity, we often enjoy games, creative activities or discussions about our theme. The sessions are a great way to make local friends, try new things and share tips with other Mums. MumCo sessions are supported with a crèche supervised by DBS-checked MumCo mums in a separate adjacent room, so you can enjoy some time out with other Mums and refreshments while they're still hot. And if your child just isn't settling, the crèche Mums reunite mothers with their children. Babes in arms are welcome in the MumCo room with their mothers and there are plenty of helpers so you enjoy a hot cuppa, being creative or having an interruption-free conversation.

On alternate weeks we have a 'Stay and Play' in the room which serves as the crèche, where mums are welcome to come and play with their children from birth up to preschool age, have a drink and chat to other mums.


Bringing children to Stay and Play and The MumCo crèche while having some time out in the next room is a great way to encourage young children to take a supportive step towards their own independence - training over months or year,s which is invaluable for when they're approaching nursery or school."

The MumCo meets at 10am on Tuesdays during school term-time in the Community Rooms at Trumpington Meadows Primary School. Already this term we've been baking, thinking about the benefits of getting outdoors, offering practical tips to inspire young and growing children, and how much time we all spend on screens and what to do about it!

# **Royal British Legion**

The commemorations around VE Day 80, rightly noted that the XIV Army (The Forgotten Army) still had three months of hard fighting ahead of it in the Far East before VJ Dav in August 1945.

In May 1945 the Cambridgeshires were still incarcerated in Singapore and Japan; and many were working in atrocious conditions on the Burma Railway in Thailand. The rations were less than 20% of what was required and despite being beaten, emaciated and sick, they still had to work. I will solemnly lay a wreath on our war memorial on 15 August to remember them.

By then I will already have ordered our supplies for the 2025 Poppy Appeal, including various sizes of poppy, and items suitable for the younger generation, and not forgetting the wreaths we all lay on the memorial in November. If you need a special wreath, please do let me know, and sooner rather than later. I know who usually takes one, but extras are available if I am asked.

Peace in various parts of the world at times seems a forlorn hope nowadays, but let us hope as we move through the summer that peace does emerge in parts of the world where wars continue without making headlines in this country.

# **Trumpington Community Orchard**

This year the Orchard burst into life with an abundance of blossom on all the apple trees and the quince tree was covered with beautiful flowers. The wildflower meadow was verdant with daffodils in March followed by lots of dandelions and a few cowslips that have attracted many butterflies including large whites, holly blues and some peacocks. The new apple trees and the small-leaf lime trees that were planted last year are growing well and have been protected by tree guards from the two adult muntjac that regularly visit the Orchard.

The wildlife habitat provided by the felled old trees continues to provide homes for a number of invertebrates and a larder for the robins and sparrows that live in the cherry thicket, bird boxes and swift tower. We hope to see the return of nesting pairs of swifts.

The recent sunny weather has reinstated the Orchard as a tranquil green space, not just for mothers and children but also teenagers who we hope will continue to respect the environment and maybe think about volunteering to help maintain it for our community.

We hope to repair and strengthen the kissing gate at the entrance and, if we can raise the funding, improve the signage with more information on the biodiversity intent behind the community orchard.

Our next Orchard next maintenance session is on Sunday 8 June. Please come dressed in weatherproof clothing and footwear and we will provide gloves and necessary tools. Hope to see you soon!

# Wildlife Trust BCN **Update for June & July**

Submitting official wildlife records is valuable, and data can contribute to research, direct green space management, and inform local planning. Anyone can submit records directly to the county-based biological records centres, (ours is Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Environmental Records Centre), or using the free app iRecord. Any wildlife record is valid, A grasshopper lands on a Guide to the butterflies from the blackbird in your garden, to the orchid in your nature reserve. If you can get

a photo, your record is more likely to be accepted. You need to know the name of the species though, so here are some identification tips:

The fold-out guides made by the Field Studies Council are great for common wildlife, fairly cheap, and are accessible for children. There are lots of different guides; I recommend: butterflies, garden birds, trees, woodland plants, and bees.

Summer is peak time for hoverflies, and they can be found anywhere there are flowers. They are useful pollinators, and amazing mimics, having the warning colours and appearance of



bees or wasps, (so predators leave them alone), but without a sting. There are over 280 species in the UK, and an average suburban garden might have 40. Did you know there is a hornet mimic which is a big fly with brown and yellow patterns, and a (hairy) bumblebee mimic which actually comes in two varieties to match different bee species, one black with a red tail, and the other with yellow stripes and a white tail? There is even a hoverfly with the batman symbol on its thorax! One of the most common, called the marmalade fly, has yellow and black stripes with little moustache patterns. This one can migrate from continental Europe. The Wildlife Trusts and the Royal Horticultural Society have teamed up to provide a free booklet about hoverflies, and how you can help them, you can find it on the Wild About Gardens website.

# **Dogs on Trumpington Meadows Nature Reserve**

Well-behaved dogs are welcome on Trumpington Meadows Nature Reserve, and in some areas they can be off the lead. We ask that dogs are on leads in the more sensitive areas of the reserve to protect ground or near-ground-nesting birds, and to reduce disturbance for all kinds of wildlife relevant all year around. It is also important near livestock, as dogs can cause stress-induced abortions, injure, or even kill, and the belted Galloway cows in the Southern meadows have calves with them through the summer. Even the most well-behaved dog off a lead can be an excuse for someone else to have their less-wellbehaved dog off a lead. If you do not see an obvious official sign, please keep your dog on a lead.
