Farewell to Mandy . . .

Revd Mandy has been on sabbatical leave since 1 May, and we are very sad to tell all our readers that she has now decided to move to pastures new from this summer. She will not be returning to active ministry at St Mary & St Michael's. Mandy has been with us since the summer of 2019 and guided us through the challenges of the Covid-19 Pandemic, leading us in rebuilding our congregation after that and now with a larger cohort of children which bodes well for the future. In addition, she has spearheaded the complex Reimagining Project to formal approval stage.

As a priest Mandy has always had and has a very strong social conscience to help all those in the parish in whatever way she could, whether active members of the congregation or not, and this was especially evident during the Covid 19 Pandemic, not only visiting the elderly but actively supporting events for young mums and initiatives such as the Food Hub. As we now move forward without her leadership, it is our duty to ensure we all continue to develop our church both physically and spiritually based on the work she has done over the last six years. We wish her well in her future career.

Consequently, from 1 September our operational church enters what is called a period of *Interregnum*, the Church of England's term for the vacancy period while a new Vicar is appointed. As Bishop's Officers it is our joint responsibility to lead everybody through this period, which could last at least a full year. We will ensure that as full a schedule of services is maintained, with visiting priests, and also that the unseen work continues as seamlessly as possible, with the assistance of Emma in the office. This will not be easy, but we will also be supported by the Parochial Church Council (PCC). Mandy maintained a schedule of supporting various parish activities and community groups and so far as is possible that will continue, though there may inevitably be gaps. We ask for your forbearance, but if you have any concerns do contact us in the first instance through Emma in the Church Office.

Finally, we ask all our readers to hold Mandy in our prayers as she starts a new challenge in her life.



Royal British Legion

Recently there has been much well-publicised coverage of several Acts of Remembrance associated with events such as VE 80, D Day 81 and Dunkirk 85. As I wrote in the last Trumpet, we will shortly commemorate VJ 80. I will be



laying a wreath at the war memorial at 11am on 15 August if anyone wishes to join me.

I believe these anniversaries have reminded everybody of the massive sacrifices made then, on a scale we cannot now imagine, and before most of us were born, enabling us to enjoy the freedom and peace we have in the United Kingdom today. During the currency of this issue, I will start asking for help from our loyal band of volunteers to operate our collecting stall in our Waitrose store from 25 October to 8 November.

We are all growing older and I am pleased that new volunteers are coming forward to help raise nearly £20,000 for the 2025 Poppy Appeal. Trumpington Local History Group

Our next scheduled talk is on Tuesday 23 September at 8pm, at the Clay Farm Centre when we will recognise the 80th anniversary of the end of World War 2 by looking at various ways in which Trumpington and its people were involved in the war.



Early in the war, a prisoner of war camp was set up to the south of Trumpington, off Hauxton Road (photo). The camp was used for German and Italian prisoners during the war. After the war it was used as a holding camp for Austrian and German prisoners awaiting return to their home countries. Finally, it was used as a National Service Hostel. Andrew Roberts and Howard Slatter will talk about the history of the camp and the evidence we have from families of prisoners as well as records from the National Archives. This will be followed by a talk by Edmund Brookes about the Cambridgeshire Regiment in the Far East and the final stages of the War.

Please note that this is on a Tuesday and also the later start time.

Trumpington Community Orchard

The wildflower meadow, now largely grass with knapweed and scabious, has been cut around the seating and paths to provide mulch for the plum and quince trees.

The flowers in the meadow provided abundant pollen and the beehive was so full that a breakaway swarm formed with a new queen and workers and departed.

The apple trees are now covered with fruit and despite ermine apple moth caterpillars eating a lot of the leaves, this does not seem to have reduced the yield of apples. For the first year, the quince tree is covered with fruit – please note that the fruit cannot be eaten raw and needs cooking first!

The wildlife habitat continues to be full of sparrows and robins, some shy thrushes and at least six pairs of nesting swifts have returned.

The kissing gate at the Orchard entrance has been

repaired and strengthened thanks to the help and funding from corporate volunteers. We are making some progress with funding to improve the signage in the Orchard and hope to have more information next time.

The Community Orchard remains a popular green space in the extended sunny weather. Unfortunately, antisocial behaviour has led to vandalism of the picnic benches. However, we are working with the local schools to develop love and respect for the environment and shared spaces for our youth.

Our next Orchard next maintenance session is planned for Sunday 14 September. As always dress in suitable clothing and footwear and we will provide gloves and necessary tools. Hope to see you soon!





Trumpington Repair Café


The eighth Trumpington Repair Café was held at the Trumpington Meadows Primary School on 8 June and was a great success as usual.
