OUR ANNUAL MEETING TAKES PLACE IN CHURCH
AFTER THE 10AM SERVICE**

All are welcome to attend. Coffee will be served as usual, while the meeting is being prepared.

Part 1: The Annual Parish Meeting (APM) takes place first and is solely to elect the two Churchwardens who will serve for the next year. All those attending may vote. This is immediately followed by:

Part 2: The Annual Parish Church Meeting (APCM) with reports from all areas of our church life, the formal adoption of the accounts for 2025, and the elections for vacancies on our Parochial Church Council (PCC).

To have a say in the outcome of the APCM elections you must be on the church's Electoral Roll.

To stand for election to the PCC, you must have been on the Electoral Roll for a minimum of 6 months. The PCC, together with the Vicar and Churchwardens, makes decisions about how the church is run. If you are interested in joining the PCC, but have not been on the Electoral Roll for long enough, it may be possible to become a co-opted member. Please speak to the Churchwardens if you are interested in joining the PCC.

Nomination forms for the role of Churchwarden and PCC member are available in church at the Churchwarden's pew.
